

The accreditation process includes eligibility requirements, program selfevaluation, on-site visit, and review by the Commission on Peer Review and Accreditation (COPRA). The rigorous process ensures the highest level of academic quality and continual improvement.



The following report is derived from the annual data survey and self-study reports of 206 programs that are accredited, or seeking (re)accreditation. NASPAA programs represent diverse student populations from around the world. With a variety of missions and resources in mind, NASPAA standards are inclusive of program types with different goals, resources, and capacities.


































Diversity Classification of Universities





Enrollment Trend




US Schools Applicants, Admits, Enrolled Students
